What results from a steadfast group of dedicated clinical professionals passionate about supporting individuals on the journey to recovery? The continual development of programs and services yielding improved outcomes and a stronger sense of hope among those we serve. How do we continue to address the needs of the most critical in our community while advancing our systems? We continue prioritizing collaboration, innovation, and invest in resources to enhance our capacity for meaningful impact. ADVANCING COLLABORATIVE OPPORTUNITIES

- CHCS joined a unique partnership through a collaborative grant with Rise Recovery, Family Service, and Clarity Child Guidance Center to holistically serve the mental health needs of children and adolescents in our area.
- In April 2022, CHCS participated in our first Fiesta San Antonio event — the Fiesta Flambeau Parade. The Fiesta Flambeau Parade is the largest illuminated night parade, bringing in over 750,000 street spectators.
- Without hesitation, we stayed resilient and provided crucial mental health support and assistance to first responders following the Robb Elementary tragedy in Uvalde.

EXPANDING EDUCATION

- Seventy-five members of our CHCS staff participated in over 90 local community outreach events and community presentations to spread awareness of mental health challenges and substance use treatment solutions available to Bexar County residents.
- The Center of Excellence for Clinical Outcomes, an internal initiative, was launched to assist CHCS staff with the tools and knowledge to serve our diverse community.

ADVANCING IN THE DIGITAL AGE

- After months of planning, testing, and implementation, CHCS officially launched a new and improved Electronic Health Record (EHR). The new system improved efficiency and productivity allowing for more efficient reporting to support the mission of a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC).
- For the first time, CHCS acquired a marketing agency of record to begin making impactful advancements to enhance the CHCS brand through innovative marketing strategies.

EXPANDING CRUCIAL SERVICES

- In April 2022, the City of San Antonio launched the San Antonio Community Outreach and Resiliency Effort (SA-CORE) program. SA-CORE deploys a team made up of a specially trained police officer, a clinician, and a paramedic, who respond to qualifying 9-1-1 calls to reduce arrests and connect those with mental health needs to services.
- The Dual Diagnosis Clinic opened its doors at the Multi-Assistance Center at Morgan's Wonderland. This clinic assists with psychiatric medication management for individuals with a diagnosis of intellectual and/or developmental disability along with a co-occurring behavioral health diagnosis.

This year's theme, Advancing and Expanding, accurately portrays the transformational impact CHCS continues to make on the community we serve. We are committed to moving forward, pushing boundaries, and reaching new heights. With your dedication and our shared vision, there's no limit to what we can achieve together. Thank you for being part of this exciting journey, and let's continue to make progress and shape a brighter future ahead. 


